



HERITAGE ENERGY RETROFIT GRANT RELAUNCH

The 2015 Heritage Energy Retrofit Grant pilot program, launched last September, filled quickly and assisted 20 homes. The City of Vancouver has agreed to renew the program's funding and the program is re-launching with some adjustments. The new program offers more inclusions such as water conservation measures, as well as the possibility of higher funding amounts.

The Heritage Energy Retrofit Grant is VHF's newest grant and is meant to assist with energy retrofits for older Vancouver homes. Homes built before 1940 and those listed on the Vancouver Heritage Register may be eligible to apply.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: FEBRUARY 1st, 2016

The deadline to apply for any of VHF's core grants is February 1st, 2016. Details of the *True Colours*, *Restore It*, *Get on the Register* and *House Call* grants are available on our website.

HERITAGE ACTION PLAN: CHARACTER HOMES

The Heritage Action Plan is ongoing with the next phase of work being the Character Home Zoning Review. This review will look at ways to encourage greater retention of pre-1940s character homes in Single Family zones, and there will be opportunities for public input and discussion this fall. Other aspects on the horizon through the HAP include the Vancouver Heritage Register update and Heritage Conservation Program review. Opportunities for public review and discussion of these components are anticipated to begin towards the end of the year and continue into 2017. ANNUAL CAMPAIGN 2016

VHF once again has a full calendar as we head into the fall season with fresh opportunities to learn about and experience Vancouver's heritage. Read on for details as well as heritage news updates, the latest on special projects, online resources and grants from VHF.

LANEWAY HOUSE TOUR

Living on the lane is not a new idea to Vancouverites but one that has gained in popularity since 2009 when lane housing was reintroduced as a densification option for RS zoned neighbourhoods. In 2016, VHF will look at six newly built lane homes in a variety of neighbourhoods, all built behind retained homes. The lane homes we select for the tour showcase thoughtful design that fits in with neighbourhood and main house character.

On October 22nd we take a look at how lane homes can be part of a heritage conservation plan with one that has been built behind the Walter and Mary Lee Chan house. The Chan house has been under significant restoration this past year including the new lane home. This and the other five homes offer an evolution of smart, small space design. From modest homes to a single-floor 850 square foot laneway, these homes are enabling family members to remain in the same neighbourhood, by offering space for relatives to live or as income helpers. Come hear owners' stories and speak with builders about the

process and regulations for building lane homes.

House tours are a great way to raise awareness of heritage and related topics, generate discussion and encourage people to see how heritage can be part of Vancouver's future.

MID-CENTURY MODERN HOUSE TOUR

Join us to explore the iconic architecture of Mid-Century Modernism. In 2016, we look at five examples of this significant design movement found in Vancouver including the impeccably-retained Friedman Residence. Designed by Fred Lasserre in 1953, this split-level home is uniquely sited on an irregular lot at UBC. It recently came on the market and many were concerned it would be demolished. However a buyer passionate for the style scooped it up and it will now be featured on our tour.

Also on the tour is an intriguing later example in a 1982 Dalla Lana/Griffin Architect designed home. Ray Griffin and Fred Dalla Lana were part of a second wave of architects picking up where earlier Modernists left off. Having learned from the masters such as Arthur Erickson and Barry Downs, Griffin and Dalla Lana's early homes updated many of Erickson's design aesthetics. This home shows the development of the style and how it continues to influence contemporary architecture.

The tour is offered either as a bus tour, with expert guides and stress-free experience without worrying about parking or navigating, or as a self-guided option. After the tour, those who select the reception option will join us at the Vancouver Maritime Museum for a wine and cheese post-tour reception including a short lecture from guest speaker Christopher MacDonald, Professor of Architecture at UBC SALA and author of *A Guide to Contemporary Architecture in Vancouver*.

SPECIAL WALKING TOUR

IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF THE PAST: RETRACING SOUTH ASIAN HISTORY IN KITSILANO

We are bringing back one of our more popular tours of 2015, featuring the lesser known South Asian history of Kitsilano. Naveen Girn, Curator and Community Engagement Specialist, Paneet Singh, Filmmaker and Researcher and Dr. Milan Singh, Lecturer and Historian will lead this tour.

In 1908, the first Sikh Gurdwara in North America opened in Kitsilano. This religious, social and political gathering place was situated next to homes owned by the South Asian community and the sawmills where they worked. This walking tour will retrace the living legacy of this important space by pointing out lost - and still existing - buildings that illustrate the intercultural past of Vancouver, the fight against racial discrimination, and the stories that still resonate today.

UPDATED MAP GUIDES



ONLINE RESOURCES UPDATE

We launched the Online Resources and Map Guide Survey in July. Thank you to all who participated! The data was used to assess our current map guides and website content. We are now in the process of updating our online resources to better reflect your interests and creating new content.

As part of this process we created a new page under the Get A Grant heading on funding opportunities available outside of VHF. This information was researched as part of a study on financial incentives for heritage as input to the Heritage Action Plan. Even with programs such as the Cultural Infrastructure program and the Heritage Legacy Fund it can be challenging to find funding. VHF grants can be helpful for smaller projects but we hope in the future to have a larger program to offer. Stay tuned for more updates and new resources throughout the fall.
