FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



2015 was a full and rewarding year for Vancouver Heritage Foundation as we delivered a wide-ranging program to promote and support heritage conservation and took an active role in supporting the Heritage Action Plan process. Through house tours, lectures, workshops and walking tours, we offered fresh opportunities to learn about our city's history and explore its built heritage. Special events, including the launch of our short documentary, *Restoring Community*, gave opportunity to explore and discuss heritage topics.

As the Heritage Action Plan got underway, VHF encouraged all to be informed and to participate by providing regular updates through our website and other communications, and running special walking tours. I was pleased to contribute to the Public Advisory Committee and to lead a small team to deliver an in-depth VHF study on the use of financial incentives for heritage. In September, we launched the Heritage Energy Retrofit Grant pilot program with funding from the City of Vancouver to support retrofits in heritage and character homes.

Once again, a large community contributed to make 2015 a success for VHF. We welcomed many new volunteers for special projects as well as program support. We ended the year with a positive financial position due to generous support from donors, sponsors, the City of Vancouver and grants that added to successful programming, fundraising and endowment income. There are many ways to get involved and support VHF. I hope you will attend an event, volunteer your time or become a donor or sponsor, and help us in our goal to ensure heritage is part of the future of our city.

OLD SCHOOL WORKSHOPS & COURSES



Wood Windows Restoration and Repair

Old School courses teach homeowners and professionals skills and knowledge for the care and maintenance of older buildings. In 2015, nine courses covered a variety of key topics including the foundational course, *Heritage 101: Introduction to Heritage Conservation* and the popular sessions of *Researching the History of a Building*. The full-day workshop, *Wood Windows Restoration and Repair* returned to provide hands-on practical training, and *Drafting a Conservation Plan* introduced the process and thinking for this important heritage tool. Continuing the series of *Neighbourhood Zoning Walks*, we explored Mount Pleasant to understand how zoning by-laws have shaped and continue to shape neighbourhoods.

A new workshop was developed and launched, *Heritage Projects: From Idea to Completion*, taking a practical look at the particular steps and considerations in managing projects on heritage buildings and sites.

The first full year of the Student Access Program enabled seven students to benefit from sponsored seats in Old School courses. We would like to offer a special thank you to the donors who provided funding to the program in 2015.

Old School student Britney Quail completed the Old School Certificate in Heritage Conservation during the year, bringing the total number of graduates to nineteen.

HERITAGE HOUSE TOUR



On June 7th, the 13th annual Heritage House Tour featured fourteen separate homes over nine stops, including two apartment buildings. The historic Queen Charlotte Apartments in the West End and The Exchange in South East False Creek added diversity to the other traditional homes on tour. Over 1000 people toured the homes. Those who ventured to the West End to see the Queen Charlotte also revelled in Rand House, a handsome Queen Anne style home. A pre-tour lecture by artist and author, Michael Kluckner entitled *A Brief History of the Vancouver Apartment and Condo* provided fascinating context for the tour.

MID-CENTURY MODERN HOUSE TOUR



By guided bus tour or private car, 220 people discovered six West Coast Modern homes from the middle decades of the 20th century. The tour featured three suites inside The Electra, originally the B.C. Electric headquarters. Converted to condos in the 1990s the building retains its Modern roots. We also saw Arthur Erickson's 1962 Danto Residence as well as his private home and garden sharing the efforts of the Arthur Erickson Foundation's conservation plan. We finished the day with a reception at a private West Coast Modern residence used in a recently released Tim Burton film.

VANCOUVER SPECIAL HOUSE TOUR



On April 18th, over 400 people visited five updated Vancouver Specials, built between the mid-60s and the mid-80s. The Vancouver Special in a variety of forms offered spacious accommodation that maximized a standard Vancouver lot with a quick, affordable build. This made-in-Vancouver design has recently regained popularity due to a flexible layout, and VHF encourages this adapt and reuse approach. In 2015, we opened several "traditional" Specials, an early example from 1962 with a Mid-Century Modern aesthetic as well as a unique side-entry style home.

LANEWAY HOUSE TOUR



In 2015, VHF continued to expand the theme of the Laneway House Tour by opening the 1990 infill built behind the Art Moderne Barber Residence. Beginning in 2014, VHF has worked to show other forms of densification used to preserve heritage homes. Five other stops offered lane homes of varying design, all built behind existing residences. The tour was very successful with 580 people enjoying the opportunity to talk with homeowners, architects, builders and our knowledgeable volunteers about the history and modern opportunities of laneway living.

WALKING TOURS



VHF's regular season of walking tours crossed the city from Boundary Road to the forest of Pacific Spirit Park, offering up an intriguing variety of architecture and geography. Some important architectural styles were also given focus including the well-loved Art Deco and less known post-war styles. A summer series of free lunch time tours highlighted West Hastings Street while other tours explored Kitsilano history, Chinatown and more.

HISTORIC KITSILANO TOURS



To celebrate and promote the launch of our Historic Kitsilano Map Guide, two guided walking tours were offered in 2015. *Ki-Chi-Ra-No: A Pre-War Japanese Canadian Community* investigated the Japanese Canadian connection to the area, while *In the Footsteps of the Past: Retracing South Asian History in Kitsilano* focused on sites significant to the South Asian community.

ASIAN HERITAGE MONTH TOURS



In May, VHF partnered with Citizenship and Immigration Canada to celebrate Asian Heritage Month. John Atkin, Maurice Guibord and Bob Sung offered four free walking tours that explored the rich histories of the Powell Street community and Chinatown including how the two communities were connected through business and food. The unique architecture of the Society and Association buildings was examined and tour goers poked into bustling shops and enjoyed treats from a local bakery.

HERITAGE SITE FINDER INTERACTIVE MAP



2015 was a productive year for the Heritage Site Finder with a lot of work accomplished thanks to a large number of volunteers who helped bring it together. Over 50 volunteers stepped forward to assist with both photography and research assignments. Over the course of the year, approximately 1800 heritage buildings were photographed and over 600 were researched and written about. The map format and function were finalized and is now fully mobile-device compatible. In-kind sponsorship from Split Mango Media Inc. and a grant from the Heritage Legacy Fund (Heritage BC) made this major project possible.

#HERITAGEREBOOT HERITAGE SITE FINDER LAUNCH



The Heritage Site Finder was launched at a free public event held on May 23, 2015 at the Yaletown Roundhouse. The date marked the 129th anniversary of the first transcontinental train arriving in Vancouver. #HeritageReboot was held in collaboration with the City of Vancouver, the City of Vancouver Archives, Heritage Vancouver Society and the West Coast Railway Association. Several digital-based heritage tools were showcased. VHF volunteers demonstrated how to use and navigate the map.

HERITAGE ACTION PLAN 2015 EVENTS



The Heritage Action Plan (HAP) was big news throughout 2015, offering an in-depth examination of heritage conservation practices in Vancouver. In addition to posting updates and opportunities for input on our website and social media channels, VHF also hosted a number of events to educate and inform the public.

Several VHF initiatives aimed to contribute directly to the HAP. The development and launch of the Heritage Site Finder made information about the Vancouver Heritage Register available in time for public nominations and consultation on updating the Register. VHF also researched and wrote an in-depth study on financial incentives for heritage in Vancouver, examining what is currently available and tools that could be used in the future. The study was concluded in November and provided to the HAP consultant team and to City of Vancouver staff. VHF also participated on the Public Advisory Committee throughout the year.

Restoring Community: Documentary and Panel Discussion

The official launch of VHF's short documentary *Restoring Community* offered an excellent opportunity for public engagement. After a screening of the film at the Vancity Theatre, we invited a panel of guests to comment on the film and respond to questions. The panel consisted of Gordon Price, Andre Rowland and Naveen Girn.

Shaughnessy Heights "The Swellest and Most Beautiful Neighbourhood"

First Shaughnessy became a hot topic of conversation as it was proposed as Vancouver's first Heritage Conservation Area. Taking the title from a vintage advertisement, John Atkin led walking tours of the area to explore its history and what makes it so special and worth protecting. Originally a one-off event, the tour proved so popular we added three additional dates.

THE WALL AT THE CBC PLAZA



In partnership with CBC Radio-Canada, with support from JJ Bean Coffee Roasters, and produced in partnership with the City of Vancouver Public Art Program, The WALL at the CBC plaza saw a new installation in 2015. The new work by Faith Moosang, entitled "down.town." uses 164 individual film frames, video stills and digital photographs to respond to questions on demolitions and change in downtown Vancouver between 1954 and 2015. An artist talk was offered at the CBC Studios to learn more from Faith about the project, her process and the experience of creating the final work.

PLACES THAT MATTER



Five further Places That Matter sites received official recognition in 2015. The history of five points on West Hastings Street were celebrated through a presentation event in cooperation with the Downtown Vancouver BIA including the installation of five informative plaques, the creation and distribution of interpretive map cards, and informative signs about each site for use during events and walking tours in the area. The five topics include Vancouver tourism, the financial district, Vancouver's harbour, parades along West Hastings and the bluff along Burrard Inlet that was once a residential area for elite Vancouverites.

VANCOUVER BUILDING BY-LAW GUIDE FOR HOMEOWNERS



With the introduction of a new Vancouver Building By-Law (building code) in January 2015, VHF saw a need for easy-to-understand reliable information for homeowners on what they need to know if planning renovations on older homes. With support from City staff, VHF wrote and published an introductory guide about the By-Law requirements for heritage and character one and two family homes specifically. It offers information on what may or may not need to be done, requirements in different types of projects and resources for further information.

HERITAGE WEEK 2015



Heritage Week celebrated a theme of *Main Street: At the Heart of the Community*, highlighting the historic centres of our neighbourhoods. VHF kicked off the week with an event outside Waterfront Station to present the official Heritage Week proclamation with Councillor Andrea Reimer. We then explored some of Vancouver's historic corridors with walking tours of Hastings Street, Commercial Street and Marpole. We also highlighted Granville Street's illustrious history with *Backstage Pass: Behind the Scenes at the Historic Commodore Ballroom*, a guided tour of the venerable music venue with author Aaron Chapman.

COMMUNICATIONS



VHF communications are a key part of our efforts to raise awareness about Vancouver's history and built heritage, and engage people across the city. Our many events give us opportunity throughout the year to share information, highlight positive heritage stories and encourage people to get involved. A print newsletter in the spring, and an online only newsletter in the fall, give a taste of what to expect over upcoming months. The bi-weekly e-newsletter gives further detail about events and went out to over 5,000 people while connections on social media continued to grow reaching over 8,000 followers on Facebook and Twitter.

VHF's reach was augmented by coverage in a variety of traditional and non-traditional media, highlighting key events such as house tours and the new grant program. A thriving relationship with CKNW radio continued, giving VHF access to a home renovation and maintenance-focused audience with heritage-related topics.

The VHF website continued to develop as a reference resource on informative heritage topics with new pages added on the Heritage Action Plan and Building By-Law guide, and updates provided regularly.

Restore It grant recipient

VHF's granting program supported a variety of heritage projects across the city, including restoration and painting work on historic houses and apartments. Projects included the drafting of a conservation plan for a home's long-term maintenance, and the research and documentation to support an application to the Vancouver Heritage Register for a Grandview-Woodlands home. A *Restore It* grant supported the restoration of original exterior lighting on the Queen Charlotte Apartments, a well-cared-for West End gem. Our continued relationship with Benjamin Moore & Co. allowed for four *True Colours* grants which assisted with the repainting of houses in historic colours, including three houses in the historic enclave of Mole Hill. These

Pendrell Street houses were among those that informed the *True Colours* historic paint palette fifteen years ago when their original paint colours were identified during restoration work. Now repainted once again, they showcase the Victorian colours in the palette very effectively.

A major addition to VHF's granting program in 2015 came with the launch of the *Heritage Energy Retrofit Grant* program in September. This pilot program was made available to twenty pre-1940 or Heritage Register homes with up to \$3,000 per home available for energy retrofits. Designed to offer additional incentive to the utilities' rebate programs, the grant targeted key measures to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in older homes while respecting heritage features and fabric. By the end of 2015, the program was already fully subscribed. Funding was provided by the City of Vancouver and VHF worked with both the City's Sustainability Group and with City Green Solutions to develop and deliver the program.

FUNDRAISING

In May, we toured behind the scenes at the Hotel Vancouver, learnt the history of the hotel and were delighted by stories from special guest Dal Richards. In October, an evening of live music, refreshments and a silent auction was held at the historic 1912 Disher House in First Shaughnessy, topped off by a special performance by VSO Music Director, Maestro Bramwell Tovey.

VHF's Endowment Fund now stands at almost \$1.4 million, managed by the Vancouver Foundation and by Odium Brown Limited. The interest generated each year helps support VHF's programs. Growing the Endowment Fund will help sustain VHF into the future.

An initial gift of \$250,000 from Colliers International was added to by further donations, starting with the Founding Pillars campaign in 2003-2004.
