2013 was a year of transition for Vancouver Heritage Foundation with Judith Mosley succeding Diane Switzer as Executive Director. Judith has quickly and effectively taken on and run a full program of events including house tours and special projects. The Brown Bag Lunch & Learn talks at BCIT Downtown Campus and the Evening Lectures at Hycroft have continued to draw in both committed regular attendees and new people attracted by specific lecture topics.

Also in 2013, the City of Vancouver prepared and adopted a Heritage Action Plan with 14 actions ranging from short to longer term, including renewal of the Vancouver Heritage Register after nearly 30 years. The City's staff report on the Action Plan referenced VHF's 2012 research project, Heritage Conservation in a Green and Growing City, undertaken with funding support from Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, that investigated public opinions on the value of heritage buildings in our community and their role in placemaking, affordability, and sustainability. The survey results made a strong case for the extent to which Vancouverites value their built heritage. Both Council members and staff mentioned that this research was a driver in initiating the Action Plan process.

The Heritage Action Plan, combined with recent discussions by the Board about its strategic planning, is shaping our Board agendas for 2014 and beyond. In particular, VHF staff and Board are seeking opportunities to participate in and influence the Heritage Action Plan as it rolls out.

The Board has renewed its membership this year with several new and energetic members. 2014 promises to be a year where the City will move forward with new heritage policies and programs and Vancouver Heritage Foundation will be working to engage the community in a wide range of programming to raise awareness of Vancouver's heritage resources.

OLD SCHOOLWORKSHOPS & COURSES



The Old School program teaches owners, professionals and the interested public how to repair, maintain, and make informed decisions about older buildings. In 2013 fifteen workshops were offered, attended by 155 people through the year.

John Atkin led a zoning walk through Shaughnessy, teasing out its complex history and looking at how zoning impacts this historic neighbourhood. New this year was a well-attended workshop delivered in partnership with the Heritage Branch, Province of BC, on writing statements of significance, a key tool in the heritage planning process. Revitalizing VHF's partnership with Benjamin Moore and Co. Limited, a workshop on historic paint colours and the True Colours palette drew an audience of homeowners and professionals keen to identify suitable paint schemes for older homes. 2013 also saw the delivery of two customized Heritage 101 workshops for the City of Richmond. The goal was to help multiple departments within the COR understand conservation practice, and how heritage requirements for managing city-owned heritage sites needed to be incorporated into their planning and inter-department operations.

Congratulations to our 2013 Heritage Conservation Old School Certificate Graduate: Adolfo Cabrera. Adolfo brings the total to 18 graduates since 2008.

BROWN BAG LUNCH & LEARN

BCIT DOWNTOWN CAMPUS



Brown Bag Lunch & Learn talks bring in speakers who offer an in-depth insight into current heritage projects through illustrated talks, from their perspectives as working professionals.

Six talks through the spring and fall covered some high profile projects in the city and touched on topical themes of downtown revitalization, affordability and sustainable practices. Talks continued to be popular with professionals and others interested in the nuts and bolts of heritage projects and their impact on wider issues. Especially well attended was a look at the historic Hudson's Bay Company building whose recent renovation returned the exterior to its early roots. Always interesting and often thought-provoking presentations were followed by the opportunity for questions to dig deeper into each topic.

Each topic addressed an aspect of the history or built heritage of Vancouver. Highlights from 2013 include the early music scene with big band legend Dal Richards, landscaping as it relates to heritage homes, and new additions to the City of Vancouver Archives.

HERITAGE HOUSE TOUR



On June 2nd, the 11th annual Heritage House Tour featured 13 houses including 5 homes clustered together in Grandview-Woodlands. Over 1000 people including 150 volunteers enjoyed touring through early Vancouver homes showcasing the possibilities in retention, restoration or renovation in efforts to sustain older homes as part of Vancouver's streetscape. VHF also offered an inaugural Heritage Info Fair where tour goers had the opportunity to speak with heritage professionals directly.

On May 21, Peter Ladner, author of *Urban Food Revolution*, gave the pre-tour lecture on urban farming.

MID-CENTURY MODERN HOUSE TOUR



By guided bus tour or private car, 220 people discovered five West Coast modern homes from the middle decades of the 20th Century. Featured homes by Fred Hollingsworth and Robert McKee highlighted the creativity of this period and the important collection found in and around Vancouver. VHF also utilized images from famed architectural photographer Selwyn Pullan, who had photographed one of the tour homes in the 1960s.

VANCOUVER SPECIAL HOUSE TOUR



A sunny September afternoon brought out nearly 400 people to visit five updated examples of this abundant housing type. Built from the mid-60s to the mid-80s, the Vancouver Special in a variety of forms offered spacious accommodation that maximized a standard Vancouver lot with a quick, affordable build. This made-in-Vancouver design has gained in popularity due to their flexible layouts and VHF encourages this adapt and reuse approach.

LANEWAY HOUSE TOUR



The number of laneway homes continues to grow across the city, and a recent expansion and update of the City's lane housing program boosted interest in VHF's 4th Laneway House Tour in October. Considerable variety in design was offered through seven homes including one of only a few in the city to support a green roof. In all cases, the principal residence had been retained including one built behind a 100-year-old home.

VHF only opens lanehouses constructed behind retained older homes.

BIKE TOURS



New in 2013, bike tours offered a different way to learn some city history and cover more of Vancouver. Our expert guides, John Atkin and Maurice Guibord put their cycling skills on display to lead both beginner and intermediate level cyclists. John led an extended tour of Places That Matter plaque sites including a chance to attend the presentation for the Nellie Yip Quong House, while Maurice took a more leisurely route to significant stops throughout Stanley Park.

WEST HASTINGS MAP GUIDE TOURS



After a soft launch in the fall of 2012, a series of guided walking tours based on the Historic West Hastings map guide were offered. A special inaugural tour with Maurice Guibord led the map guide project partner, Downtown Vancouver Business Improvement Association, to key sites. Subsquent tours were then offered to the general public as part of the 2013 walking tour line-up.

WALKING TOURS



A full program of walking tours through the spring and summer continued in 2013 as a mainstay of VHF's programs. Experienced guides and historians, Maurice Guibord and John Atkin took up to 25 locals and tourists on 20 tours in neighbourhoods across the city, engaging them with the history of each area and their relationship to the built environment and heritage today.

Two special walking tours were delivered in 2013. The first was on Jewish Strathcona in partnership with the Jewish Museum and Archives of BC, and the second on Public Art, each delivered by guest guides. In August, a free Walking Tour of the Georgia Street Viaducts and their context was offered to winners of a social media contest bringing VHF and our walking tours to the attention of a new audience.

FILM NIGHTS AT THE HOLLYWOOD



2013 saw the rare opportunity to partner with the Church at the Hollywood, tenants in the Hollywood Theatre, to host a history, design and architecture film series. Films ranged from documentaries about Modernism and Vancouver's early planning ideals, to the late 1940s theatre release with Gary Cooper, *The Fountainhead*, which was the last film to be screened at the Hollywood prior to its current closure. Turnout varied from 70 people to over 350. Volunteers managed the popcorn machine and the theatre was utilized for its original use briefly. The local community was delighted to see the theatre back in operation with relevant and fun films.

SUNDAY MORNING

AT THE MARINE



VHF paired with JJ Bean Coffee Roasters to offer a new experience in heritage that combined Vancouver's love of coffee with its love of architecture and heritage. The inaugural event was held at a newly renovated café in the Marine Building lobby where guests learned about coffee pairings and how the new space was incorporated into a historic building. The event sold out all 60 spaces within a few days inspiring VHF to run a second sitting of the event in the fall. Both iterations of the event were a huge success spurring a new series of 'Sunday Morning' events for 2014.

SAVOURING HERITAGEAT THE YALETOWN BREWPUB



VHF partnered with the Yaletown Brew Pub and the Planning Institute of BC to offer an evening that combined railyard history and craft beer. A group of 80 people went on a walking tour of Yaletown and heard a talk on warehouse history with John Atkin, tasted locally crafted beers with Yaletown head brewer lain Hill, and enjoyed delicious pub themed snacks. By capitalizing on a modern trend of appreciating local product VHF inspired craft beer enthusiasts to learn the history behind the brew.

THE WALL AT THE CBC OUTDOOR STAGE



VHF continued the partnership with JJ Bean Coffee Roasters and CBC Radio-Canada to install and launch a new artwork for The WALL at CBC plaza. This public art exhibit, in its fourth year, featured a work by artist Paul de Guzman titled "the people are the city..." which features a Franz Lindner image from the CBC Archives with text borrowed from a headline in the CBC Times, a weekly programming guide published during the 1960's. The artwork was installed in March with a free public event with music and coffee.

HERITAGE WEEKFEBRUARY 2013



VHF offered a full program of events in Heritage Week, a Province-wide celebration of built heritage held late February, and launched by national Heritage Day. VHF hosted walking tours, including one in partnership with the Jewish Museum and Archives that wandered through Jewish Strathcona, a philosopher's cafe led by John Atkin on "Why Heritage Matters", and the launch of the Historic West Hastings map guide. Places That Matter capped off the week with a well attended presentation for Hogan's Alley.

PLACES THAT MATTER PLAQUE PROJECT



The Places That Matter Plaque Project rolled along in 2013 with presentations bringing us to #71 by the end of 2013. Highlights of the year included a trip to the PNE to present plaques for the wooden rollercoaster and Pacific Coliseum at the famous SuperDogs show. VHF also celebrated multicultural sites such as Hogan's Alley which shed light on Vancouver's lesser known black history, the Punjabi Market embracing South Asian roots, and the Russian Community Centre, home of the Russian Balalaika Orchestra. VHF greatly appreciates all 2013 plaque sponsors for making the project possible.


SUSTAINABILITY CASE STUDIES



VHF completed three case studies, employing UBC Environmental Design student Sam McFaul to research and write under guidance from VHF staff. The case studies explore how three heritage related projects contributed to achieving sustainability goals in Vancouver. As well as adding to our selection of informative case studies, the process offered a unique opportunity for VHF's intern to interact with the professionals and building owners involved with each project and to present the findings to our Brown Bag Lunch & Learn audience.

HERITAGE CONSERVATION IN A GREEN AND GROWING CITY



VHF released the findings of a public survey and stake-holder interviews in early 2013: Heritage Conservation in a Green and Growing City. An infographic summarizing the key findings was also disseminated widely. The survey findings provided a clear picture of the strength of support for heritage retention and rehabilitation among Vancouver residents, and the connection to city priorities of affordability, energy efficiency and density.

COMMUNICATIONS



Digital media is fast becoming the most effective method to reach an audience. In 2013 VHF made strides to not only keep up with the flow of new information available online, but also maintain a modern face for heritage by remaining present in social media. This allowed VHF to spread the conservation message further afield while reaching new and younger audiences.

Over the course of the year social media engagement has doubled to over 5,600 followers. Another 5,200 are signed up for regular email communications, and the bi-annual newsletter is mailed to over 5,000 homes. VHF regularly contributed posts to three of Vancouver's most popular blogs in 2013; Vancouver is Awesome, Scout Magazine and Spacing Vancouver. A new relationship with CKNW radio allowed VHF messaging to reach across BC. VHF also partnered with Homes & Living Magazine, a West Coast based luxury design and home furnishings magazine, providing an illustrated article for each of the six issues through the year.

VHF WEBSITE

Following on the 2012 launch of a new brand identity, in February 2013, VHF launched a new website. It offers a user-friendly interface and improved functionality to provide and organize resources for public use, as well as information and registration functions for VHF programs. This new website has also allowed VHF to utilize Google Anaytics to gain insight into our online presence and effectiveness.

The website was developed in partnership with local web services company Split Mango Media Inc.

2013 was another successful granting year, with nine grants offered to homeowners and community groups. VHF assisted several homeowners with two window restoration projects, a new roof, some exterior repairs and two True Colours grants. The owners of 2806 W 38th Avenue were accepted to the Vancouver Heritage Register through a Get on the Register grant.

VHF offered a True Colours grant to the Marpole Museum, also known as Colbourne House. A True Colours grant was also provided to the Hollywood Theatre, home to the Point Grey Community Church. At the end of 2013, the building's future remained in limbo, but the initiative to restore the exterior brought fresh attention to the loss of heritage cultural spaces in Vancouver. VHF remains optimistic that the future owners will continue plans to restore the neon sign, currently held in storage.

Thank you to all who volunteered their time and expertise on the Granting committee and to all partners who supported the grants program in 2013: Benjamin Moore Co. Limited, Donald Luxton, Margot Keate-West, and the Heritage Planning Group at City of Vancouver. VHF is pleased to continue to offer home and building owners in Vancouver assistance with the long term maintenance of these buildings that contribute so much to our streets and neighbourhoods.
