
How much do Vancouverites **LOVE** their heritage buildings?

Our Environment




72% agree that heritage buildings contribute to an **environmentally sustainable** city.



50% agree that heritage buildings provide housing that is gentle on the environment.

26%



A new home that is designed to be 30% more efficient than an existing home takes 50 years to make up the greenhouse gas emissions used during its construction.



50% of construction waste is salvageable and reusable.



50% would prefer to live in a heritage building with **energy retrofits*** over heritage buildings with original features or a new building.

*Improvements made to an existing structure which provide an increase in the overall energy efficiency performance of the building.



49% would pay more to live in a retrofitted heritage building.

Affordability



42% believe that heritage buildings offer affordable rental stock in the city.

The majority of Vancouver's 24,000 social, non-profit and co-operative housing units were built in the 1960s, 1970s and 1980s.

Tourism



believe that heritage buildings attract tourists. 88% of overseas travellers list visiting historical and cultural attractions as their **top two priorities**.

There is strong public support for keeping our older buildings, especially ones that are updated and retrofitted.
