#### **2025 Accomplishments**

2025 has been a year filled with successes for Vancouver Heritage Foundation. With additional staff power to broaden our reach and share knowledge about Vancouver's heritage places and their stories, your donations are more impactful than ever!

VHF prioritizes conserving the full scope of heritage in our work through valuing both tangible and intangible heritage. We achieve our mission to advance the appreciation and conservation of Vancouver's heritage places and their stories through our three branches of work:

Education & Awareness
 Policy Work with City of Vancouver
 Practical Support for Conservation Projects



We offer a year-round program calendar of events including walking tours, Heritage Hour lectures, virtual Lunch & Learn sessions, professional development days for teachers and special events like book launch celebrations. VHF also celebrates three major annual events: Heritage Week in February, Historic Places Days in July and our signature Heritage Discovery Day tour of a Vancouver neighborhood's heritage homes and community sites. We are the primary organization in Vancouver that celebrates Provincial BC Heritage Week and National Historic Places Days. Each year the Mayor or Deputy Mayor of Vancouver delivers an official proclamation recognizing Vancouver Heritage Foundation's Heritage Week events as having cultural, historic and civic value to Vancouver.

NEW! Our Heritage 101 on Demand course – the cornerstone of our Heritage Conservation Education accredited certificate program – launched in full in early 2025 after completing a pilot cohort in late 2024. This is a major accomplishment for VHF, as the new remote access and self-determined pacing to Heritage 101 on Demand makes the Heritage Conservation Education program available to more people – from more places, provincially and nationally - than ever before!

We continued to celebrate our three annual major event series, Heritage Week in February, Heritage Discovery Day in June and Historic Places Days in July.

### Heritage Week

Our annual Winter Storytelling event at Hycroft Manor featured speakers five speakers from important cultural communities in Vancouver who stories of their experiences and accomplishments. In 2025 we were proud to host Japanese Canadian Hastings Park Interpretive Centre Society (JCHPICS) President Daniel Tokawa and Lorene Oikawa, past president for the National Association of Japanese Canadians; Leona Brown, Indigenous Independent Cultural Facilitator and co-creator of Vancouver Urban Food Forest Foundation; Sheila Kirkby, longtime volunteer at Kitsilano Neighborhood House and Melinda Suto, Secretary of Vancouver Folk Music Fest's Board of Directors. Deputy Mayor Sarah Kirby-Yung presented the Proclamation of Heritage Week 2025 at the Winter Storytelling event.





### **Places That Matter Community Fair**

The Places That Matter Community Fair during Heritage Week is a free, family-friendly event designed to connect community members with cultural organizations that steward Vancouver's historic places and stories. Our 2025 Community Fair at Heritage Hall hosted 70 representatives of 29 community organizations that represent sites on Places That Matter, our community-nominated Vancouver heritage resource. Over 270 attendees to the Community Fair engaged with the proponents of some of Vancouver's Places That Matter this year.







## **Heritage Discovery Day**


On June 7<sup>th</sup> over 550 ticketholders and 170 volunteers experienced a tour of the historic Kitsilano neighborhood. The nine sites on the tour consisted of seven privately owned heritage homes and two community sites.





### **Historic Places Days**

For the second year in a row, VHF's expanded capacity allowed us to host events during National Historic Places Days. We held two sold-out tours of the Vancouver Block with a behind the scenes look at the iconic clock, hosted by friend of VHF and renowned heritage expert Don Luxton.





We introduced a new event for Historic Places Days in 2025: An Evening of Heritage at Hollywood Theatre. With 120 attendees, the event was extremely well received by participants. Speakers Michelle Barile from West Broadway BIA and historians Tom Carter and John Atkin presented on the resilience of Hollywood Theatre, the fascinating history of movie theatres in Vancouver and their influence on the city.


#### **Places That Matter**

# VHF's Relationship with the City of Vancouver

As a Civic Agency, Vancouver Heritage Foundation has a dedicated liaison to City Council as an ex-officio member of our Board of Directors. Our liaison is Councillor Lisa Dominato, who has served in this capacity since 2023. Our Board of Directors also includes City of Vancouver's Senior Heritage Planner, Zlatan Jankovic and Chair of the Heritage Commission, James Evans as ex-officio members. VHF's robust relationship with the City of Vancouver creates opportunities for us to give feedback on policies directly to City Council and the department head of Heritage Planning.

In late 2024, the City of Vancouver completed the first update to the Vancouver Heritage Register since its creation in 1986. Over a two-year consultation period, VHF provided input on the policy changes. Major updates include removing the A/B/C site categories, adding a Truth Statement acknowledging the exclusion of intangible heritage, and expanding eligibility to include more forms of cultural heritage.




### Heritage Site Finder

Vancouver Heritage Foundation's Heritage Site Finder website is a user-friendly, mapbased guide to sites listed on the Heritage

Register. We collect community stories and relevant historical information about each site on the Heritage Register, creating an accessible resource for the public. In early 2025 we completed updates to Heritage Site Finder that reflect the





changes to the Heritage Register, keeping the resource up to date and relevant to the changing landscape of Vancouver's heritage policies.



VHF's Heritage Conservation Education courses teach skills and knowledge related to the care and maintenance of older buildings and heritage sites for homeowners, building owners, and professionals. Formerly known as "Old School," these courses and workshops are offered in a variety of formats, with in-person sessions being held in the Lower Mainland as well as virtual sessions hosted via Zoom.

## **Yosef Wosk Publication Grant**



Yosef Wosk Publication Grants support new, original publications on aspects of Vancouver's heritage places, their conservation and related topics.



Jonah Lee-McNamee 2025 Recipient

The grant will support the production of a short documentary film that explores the architectural and historical significance of the Dodek Residence, a heritage home designed by Canadian architect Ron Thom.

Jonah has secured exclusive access to the property and will include interviews with Peter Dodek, Gail Dodek-Wenner, and Carla Dodek, who will offer firsthand perspectives on the home's legacy. The film will also feature commentary from architectural writer Adele Weder, author of a book on Ron Thom.



Christine Hagemoen 2025 Recipient

With the help of the grant, Christine will create "Mount Pleasant Stories: Historical Walking Tours, Walk 2" - a continuation of the 2021 publication of "Mount Pleasant Stories: Historical Walking Tours (Walk 1)".

This new edition focuses on Lower Mount Pleasant, spanning the light-industrial, commercial, and residential area north of Broadway to False Creek.



Carmel Tanaka 2025 Recipient

With the support of our Yosef Wosk Publication Grant, the Jewpanese Project, created by Carmel Tanaka, is amplifying stories at the intersection of Jewish and Japanese identity. By combining video and written interviews into an interactive online exhibit, the project explores powerful themes of cultural identity, belonging, and acceptance.



# Robert Lemon Heritage Studies Prize



The 2025 Robert Lemon Heritage Studies Prize has been awarded to Marion Benkaiouche, a Simon Fraser University Urban Studies student. Her project, Mapping the Landscape of Publishing Businesses Continuity in Vancouver, explores the city's literary printing history and the role of the built environment in supporting artistic creation.




# Heritage Conservation Grants



VHF awarded 29 Heritage Conservation grants in the last 12 months, totaling \$253,625 in funding. Among the recipients are Arts Club Theatre Company's Stanley Industrial Alliance Stage, Pennsylvania Hotel and Hycroft Manor, in addition to privately owned heritage properties.






#### **True Colours Palette**

**Sponsored by Sherwin Williams** 

An additional element to our conservation grant program is the True Colours paint grant in partnership with Sherwin Williams. The grant provides paint from the True Colours palette, consisting of 40 original paint colours that were used on houses and buildings in Vancouver from the 1880s to the 1920s, often chosen by the first owners and builders. In the last 12 months seven heritage properties in Vancouver have accessed the True Colours grant, contributing to Vancouver's many heritage streetscapes.

# Continuing our Success in the Future: Strategic Priorities 2026-2028

In 2025 we complete our existing 2023-2025 strategic plan. A new 2026-2028 strategic plan was created over a period of four months with input from every member of the VHF staff team. We are excited to announce our five strategic priorities that support the major areas of our work: education, policy work with the City of Vancouver, and practical support for conservation. The guiding principle of our 2026-2028 strategic planning is to knit together all branches of VHF's work.

# 1 Education

With expanded staff capacity, VHF will deliver more educational programs than ever. From 2026–2028, we'll build on Heritage 101 On Demand to expand digital learning and deepen both in-person and online content for the Heritage Conservation Education Certificate program. VHF will continue year-round programming, including Heritage Week, Historic Places Days, and Heritage Discovery Day, while increasing participation by partnering with larger venues, offering double sessions, and repeating popular events like topical walking tours.

# 2 Branding, Marketing, and Communications

By tightening our branding, marketing and communications VHF can differentiate our identity and our work from other heritage organizations in Vancouver. Goals include creating a new marketing plan for 2026-2028 and annual marketing calendars that inform our programming and event promotions.

## **3** Community Connections

As community connectors, VHF will continue to build and maintain equitable relationships with our Host Nations and Vancouver's diverse culture groups. VHF will continue to platform communities who steward heritage places and their stories with our educational programming and Places That Matter project. VHF will celebrate the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Places That Matter in 2026.

## 4 Support for Heritage Conservation

VHF will expand financial support for heritage conservation through its grant programs. We will continue to administer the Heritage Conservation Grant for the City of Vancouver under a renewed 2027–2030 agreement, and offer the Yosef Wosk Publication Grant, Robert Lemon Heritage Studies Prize, and True Colours paint grant annually. VHF will also maintain collaboration with the City of Vancouver, the Heritage Planning department, the Heritage Commission, and City Council to strengthen heritage retention policies in long-term planning.

# **5** Long-term Funding

To achieve long-term funding goals, VHF will collaborate with corporate sponsors, grant funders, donors, and the City of Vancouver while expanding revenue-generating initiatives. Priorities include developing a unified annual sponsorship package, a grant application plan, legacy giving opportunities, updated operating and investment policies, and increased capacity for ticketed programs and events.
